

From the desk of Father Koys Dear Parishioners,

"I rejoiced when I heard them say, let us go up to the Father's house." In my last article, I shared my new love for the classic children's story Pinocchio.

There is so much more to consider about the personal life of Collodi, the author, but I shall only encourage you to read the new book, *Pinocchio: With Reflections On a Father's Love.* One of the many times in the story when Pinocchio feels repentant, and he deeply recognizes that he is among the worst of all boys who have disappointed and hurt their fathers turns out to be a perfect example for us on this feast of Christ the King.

Although the original book is far superior in many ways to the well-known Disney movie, this scene in the movie, where Pinocchio finally gets back to his "father's" house has gained a permanent place in my list of favorite movie shorts. I must quickly add that there are literally dozens and dozens of Pinocchio movies. Almost all of them completely ignore or even terribly miss the beauty and the Catholic imagery of the puppet boy banging on the door shouting joyfully. It is a Catholic scene not a Protestant scene.

In the book, we learn of his repentant heart, but reading about his pleas to "open the door" doesn't have the emotional level as the Disney Pinocchio. The book says, "Open up, it's me, Pinocchio." But in the movie, Pinocchio says "Open up, Father, it's me, Pinocchio." I must confess, the movie moves my heart because it stirs my childhood memories. To hear a voice from the past with a fresh understanding of the wonder of the character resembles those times when we hear a loved one's voice after a long period of absence. But more than that, he is calling on his father. The beautiful connection is made between realizing that he has misbehaved and realizing he has hurt his father. He's filled with happiness to be banging on his father's

door. In that happiness, there is a kind of naïveté. The thought doesn't occur to him that his father might be very mad and ready to give him the punishment he surely deserves. He assumes his repentance is enough to turn his father's heart back to him. If you know the story, you know his father isn't there. But he isn't there not because his father has given up on him, but because his father has gone in search of him. Pinocchio's passion changes from a passion for pleasure to a passion for finding his father. Now for the connection to our feast.

Pinocchio, searching for his father, captures the whole meaning of our Catholic faith. God wants us to search for Him, but it's only when we can see His loving heart as He dies that we see the extent to which He is willing to go to save us. His efforts to save us are far more sacrificial than ours. In the Cross, we realize, "This is how much He loves me." In the Cross, we realize that He searches for us more than we search for Him, and when we find Him, He isn't going to whoop us.

THE "FIRST" THANKSGIVING















A legendary Thanksgiving celebration was held in 1621. The terrible winter of the previous year had been difficult for the Pilgrims. Many of the Pilgrims had died because of illness and lack of shelter. The Thanksgiving celebration was held after the Pilgrims had their first harvest—after they had gathered their first crops.

The writings of the Pilgrims tell us that about 140 people attended the three-day celebration. Ninety of the people were Wampanoag men. About 50 people were Pilgrims. Only four of the Pilgrims at the party were women. The feast was held outside because the Pilgrims did not have a building large enough to hold so many people.

The Pilgrims were thankful for the harvest and for the help of the Wampanoag in teaching them to grow crops in America. Without their help, the Pilgrims would have had little to eat. The menu for the first Thanksgiving included *venison*, or deer meat, and *fowl*, which included ducks, geese, and turkeys. Sea bass, cod fish, cornmeal, fruits and vegetables were also served.

Games were played, and singing and dancing were also part of the celebration. Praises were given to God for the harvest and for the Pilgrims that survived the harsh winter.

Thanksgiving in America is now celebrated on the fourth Thursday in November. Families prepare a meal similar to the meal prepared by the Pilgrims and Wampanoag 400 years ago. It is a time for counting the blessings we have received during the year and for spending time with family and friends.

We would like to invite all RE students, Families, and Staff Members to join us in worship at Thanksgiving Day Mass on Thursday, November 27, 2025 at 9:00AM.

Our 7th grade students from the Wednesday session are visiting and learning the history of our beautiful church.



Z biurka wikariusza proboszcza Drodzy Parafianie,

"Ucieszyłem się, gdy mi powiedziano: pójdziemy do domu Ojca." W moim ostatnim artykule podzieliłem się moją nowo odkrytą miłością do klasycznej dziecięcej opowieści Pinokio. Jest

jeszcze wiele do rozważenia na temat osobistego życia Collodiego, autora tej historii, ale tym razem chcę jedynie zachęcić was do przeczytania nowej książki jaką jest Pinokio: Rozważania o Ojcowskiej Miłości (Pinocchio: With Reflections on a Father's Love). Jedna z wielu scen, w której Pinokio czuje skruchę i głęboko uświadamia sobie, że należy do najgorszych chłopców, którzy zawiedli i zranili swoich ojców, okazuje się dla nas doskonałym przykładem do przeżycia uroczystości Chrystusa Króla.

Choć oryginalna książka pod wieloma względami znacznie przewyższa znany film Disneya, to jednak scena z filmu, w której Pinokio wreszcie powraca do "domu ojca", zajmuje trwałe miejsce na mojej liście ulubionych filmowych momentów. Muszę szybko dodać, że istnieją dosłownie dziesiątki wersji Pinokia. Prawie wszystkie całkowicie pomijają lub wręcz tragicznie gubią piękno i katolicką symbolikę sceny, w której drewniany chłopiec z radością wali w drzwi. Z dumą przyznam, że jest to scena katolicka, a nie protestancka.

W książce poznajemy skruszone serce Pinokia, ale czytając o jego błaganiach, by "otworzyć drzwi", nie odczuwamy tych emocji, jakie niesie film Disneya. W książce pisze: "Otwórz, to ja, Pinokio", natomiast w filmie chłopiec krzyczy: "Otwórz, Ojcze, to ja, Pinokio." Muszę wyznać, że ta filmowa scena poruszyła moje serce przywołując wspomnienia z dzieciństwa. Usłyszeć głos z przeszłości z nowym zrozumieniem cudowności tej postaci przypomina te chwile, kiedy po długiej nieobecności słyszymy głos ukochanej osoby. Najważniejsze w tym jest to, że on woła swego ojca. Jest to piękne połączenie: świadomości złego postępowania i świadomości zranienia ojca. Pinokio jest szczęśliwy, że może walić w drzwi ojcowskiego domu. W tej radości jest pewna naiwność. Nie przychodzi mu do głowy, że ojciec może być bardzo zły i gotowy wymierzyć mu zasłużoną karę.

Poprostu zakłada, że jego skrucha wystarczy, by serce ojca znów zwróciło się ku niemu. Jeśli znasz tę historię, to wiesz, że ojca nie było za zamkniętymi drzwiami. Ale nie dlatego, że ojciec się poddał, lecz dlatego, że wyruszył, by go szukać. Pasja Pinokia zmienia się z pasji radości w pasję odnalezienia ojca. W tym miejscu właśnie dochodzimy do porównania tego wydarzenia z naszą uroczystością Chrystusa Króla.

Pinokio, szukający swojego ojca, oddaje całą istotę naszej katolickiej wiary. Bóg pragnie abyśmy Go nieustannie szukali, ale dopiero gdy zobaczymy Jego kochające Serce umierające na krzyżu, dostrzegamy, jak daleko jest gotów się posunąć, by nas ocalić. Jego wysiłek by nas zbawić jest o wiele bardziej ofiarny niż nasz. W krzyżu odkrywamy jak bardzo nas kocha. W krzyżu odkrywamy, że to On szuka nas bardziej, niż my szukamy Jego, ale gdy Go już odnajdziemy, to nie czeka nas chłosta, lecz miłość.
