## From the desk of Father Koys Dear Parishioners,

How is it that an anti-Catholic revolutionary Italian gave us one of modernity's most touching "Catholic parables?" Carlo Collodi wrote Pinocchio in 1881

after serving in the Army of the Piedmont. He was part of the unification war to unite Italy as one nation. It's strange, the "risorgimento" movement, as it was called, was like our USA Revolution, but if we look closer, it was very unlike ours. Both wars were fought to establish a nation, but our revolution was a war of independence from a king. The Italian version was a war to destroy the independence of the "states" and establish a king.

The group, 'Well Read Moms', published "Pinocchio, with Reflections on a Father's Love," by Franco Nembrini. It should be a must-read for all young people. The story of Pinocchio known to most of us because of the Disney movie—is only a fraction of the fascinating story found in the original book. We often say, "the book was better than the movie," but let's face it. a movie is easier to watch than the book is to read. Pinocchio, of course, is the loveable puppet who yearns to be a real boy. He gets himself into so much trouble, especially because he has that terrible habit of lying. We all know that his nose grows when he lies, and he eventually does become a boy. But the reason for my article today is to call attention to real story behind the parable. I ask you, how is it that one revolution is all about dethroning a king and another revolution is all about installing one?

As a God fearing patriotic American, I confess I'm partial to the American Revolution, but not for the reasons generally cited.
Contemplating the differences between these two important modern events of world history, the Gospel can shed significant light. Many applaud the American Revolution because it eliminated the political system known as the

monarchy. Many will say, "Kings are bad, power to the people." If kings are bad, why did Italy want one when they didn't have one?

Today, as a believer in Jesus Christ, I'm prepared to say that I applaud the dethroning of George III, not because I believe democracy is innately superior to a monarchy. I sing our National Anthem with pride because those who made America saw in George III, a man who blatantly abused two key political principals that flow directly from Catholicism, namely: subsidiarity and suzerainty. Italy's war made a similar mistake. People like Collodi fought not only against people who didn't want a king, but fought directly against Catholicism that provided wisdom and a world view that they rejected.

But wait, my next article will be on Collodi's conversion.



On November 9, 2025, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the oldest and highest ranking of the four major basilicas in Rome and the only archbasilica in the world. The Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the diocese of Rome, the official ecclesiastical seat of the Holy Father, the Bishop of Rome, not St. Peter's Basilica as so many mistakenly believe. The Basilica is also called the Church of the Most Holy Savior or the Church of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist. In ancient Rome, this was the church where everyone was baptized. It the oldest church in the West, built in the time of Constantine and was consecrated by Pope Saint Sylvester I in 324. This feast became a universal celebration in honor of the archbasilica, the ecclesiastical mother church, called "the mother and head of all the churches in the city and the world" (omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput), as a sign of love for and union with the See of Peter.







## A Note From Cardinal Blase Cupich

The Church teaches that receiving Holy Communion is not a private action but a communal one, as the very word "communion" implies. For that reason, the norm established by the Holy See for the universal Church and approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops is for the faithful to process together as an expression of their coming forward as the Body of Christ and to receive Holy

Communion standing. Processions are an ancient practice of the Church and have been part of the liturgy from the earliest days, assisting the faithful to always keep in mind that we are a pilgrim people, making our way together to the fulness of the heavenly banquet Christ has prepared for us. We process into the church. We process up to bring the gifts. We process to receive Holy Communion. We process out to carry the Lord into the world.

Nothing should be done to impede this sacred ritual of receiving communion or diminish its powerful symbol by disrupting an important moment by which the faithful, in processing together, express their faith that they are called to become the very Body of Christ they receive. Certainly, reverence can and should be expressed by bowing before the reception of Holy Communion, but no one should engage in a gesture that calls attention to oneself or disrupts the flow of the procession by assuming another posture. That would be contrary to the norms and tradition of the church, which all the faithful are urged to respect and observe.




#### Second Collection November 15th & 16th Catholic Campaign for Human Development

## Lemont Catholic Anointing of the Sick Bilingual Mass

On Saturday, November 15th,

SS. Cyril & Methodius Parish will celebrate the Anointing of the Sick at the 11 AM Mass. This will be a bilingual (English-Polish) Mass.

We extend an invitation to those in our Lemont Catholic Family who feel that the Celebration of Anointing will provide help for them in sickness and aging of their bodies.

In the past, the anointing was done near the time of death. Theology today understands anointing as the Sacrament of the Sick rather than at the time of approaching death. The Anointing of the Sick is the prayer of Christ and His Church for the physical and spiritual health of the sick person.

Who may be anointed?

- A sick person may be anointed before he/she undergoes surgery, whether or not the surgery is serious.
- Persons with chronic illness.
- Older persons, even if they are not suffering from dangerous illness.
- Mentally disabled persons and chemically dependent persons.
- \* A sick child may be anointed in order to be comforted and uplifted by the Sacrament.

#### Bal Wszystkich Świętych w Lemont – niebo było naprawdę blisko!

Czwarta edycja Balu Wszystkich Świętych w Lemont po raz kolejny udowodniła, że gdy działa Duch Święty, dzieją się prawdziwe cuda! To wydarzenie zjednoczyło ludzi o wielkich sercach: Parafię SS. ## Z biurka wikariusza proboszcza Drodzy Parafianie,

Jak to możliwe, że antykatolicki rewolucjonista z Włoch podarował nam jedną z najbardziej zmodernizowanych i poruszających "katolickich przypowieści". Carlo

Collodi napisał Pinokia w 1881 roku, po służbie w armii Piemontu. Brał udział w wojnie, której celem było połączenie Włoch w jedno państwo. Warto zwrócić uwagę na to, że ruch ten, zwany risorgimento, był podobny do naszej amerykańskiej rewolucji, jednak gdy się przyjrzymy bliżej tej sytuacji to w rzeczywistości był zupełnie inny. Celem obydwu wojen było ustanowienie państwa, jednak nasza rewolucja była wojną o niepodległość od króla, podczas gdy włoska wersja była wojną o zniszczenie niezależności poszczególnych "stanów" i ustanowienie króla.

Grupa Well Read Moms (Obczytane Mamy) opublikowała książkę Pinokio z refleksjami o ojcowskiej miłości, których autorem był Franco Nembriniego. To książka, którą powinien przeczytać każdy młody człowiek. Historia Pinokia, znana większości z nas dzięki filmowi Disneya, to tylko fragment fascynującej opowieści zawartej w oryginalnej książce. Często się słyszy: "książka była lepsza niż film", ale prawda jest taka, że film łatwiej obejrzeć niż przeczytać książkę. Pinokio to oczywiście uroczy pajacyk, który pragnie zostać prawdziwym chłopcem. Wpada w wiele kłopotów, głównie dlatego, że ma straszny nawyk kłamania. Wszyscy wiemy, że jego nos rośnie, gdy kłamie, i że ostatecznie rzeczywiście staje się chłopcem. Ale powodem dla którego piszę ten tekst jest zwrócenie uwagi na prawdziwą historię kryjącą się za tą przypowieścią. Tutaj właśnie zadam pytanie: jak to możliwe, że jedna rewolucja polegała na obaleniu króla, a inna na jego ustanowieniu?



## Why Catholics Prefer Burial Over Cremation and the Proper Handling of Ashes

The Catholic Church has a long tradition regarding the treatment of the body after death. While most Catholics choose burial, cremation has become more accepted in recent years. What are the Church's teachings on the proper disposition of the dead body or the cremated remains?

Why Catholics Prefer Not to Cremate Historically, the Catholic Church strongly favored burial over cremation. This preference is rooted in several theological and spiritual beliefs:

• Respect for the Body: Catholics believe the body is a temple of the Holy Spirit and should be treated with dignity, even

after death. Burial reflects this respect and the belief in the eventual resurrection of the body.


- Imitation of Christ: Jesus Christ was buried after his crucifixion. Burial allows Catholics to follow Christ's example and participate in the hope of resurrection.
- Symbolism of Burial: Burial symbolizes the sowing of a seed, as referenced in Scripture (1 Corinthians 15:42-44), which will be raised in a new and glorified form at the resurrection.
- Historical Associations: In the past, cremation was sometimes chosen by pagans to deny Christian beliefs in resurrection. The Church discouraged cremation to distance itself from these pagan intentions.



Church began to permit cremation, provided it was not chosen as a sign of denial of faith in the resurrection. The Church recognizes practical reasons for choosing cremation, such as financial constraints, environmental concerns, or health regulations. However, the Church still expresses a preference for burial when possible.

Why Ashes Should Be Buried If cremation is chosen, the Catholic Church has clear guidelines regarding the treatment of ashes:

- Permanent Resting Place: Ashes should be buried in a cemetery, mausoleum, or columbarium. This ensures the
  remains are treated with the same respect as a full body burial and provides a sacred place for remembrance and
  prayer.
- Prohibition of Scattering or Dividing Ashes: The Church prohibits scattering ashes, keeping them at home, or dividing
  them among family members. These practices can diminish the respect due to the deceased and contradict the belief
  in the unity of the body.
- Communal Witness: Burial in a sacred place reflects the communal nature of the Church and allows the faithful to remember and pray for the dead together.


