

Dear Parishioners,

What does being a Christian mean in terms of daily behavior? If someone comes up to you and slaps you on the face, is that person acting like a Christian? Certainly, we would say "no." Yet, while it is so clear that you can't be a good Christian by slapping

people, some people say that you can destroy a baby within the mother's womb by abortion and still be a good Christian. Something is deeply wrong with this way of thinking. How can killing be OK but slapping in the face be wrong? To be Christian means to stand on the side of life. It means that we oppose the killing of the innocent at all times. It means that we respect human life at all its stages and in all its conditions. This weekend is dedicated to respect of life, so let me focus on the topic of abortion.

There are many assaults on human life in our society. In large measure, however, people have recourse to the law to protect their rights and receive compensation for damages. There is an entire class of people, however, who are assaulted daily and have absolutely NO recourse to the law at all. In fact, the law doesn't even recognize them as persons. We are referring, of course, to the pre-born boys and girls in their mothers' wombs. They have nobody to speak up for them.... nobody, that is, except us. Are we Christian enough to recognize their needs and to speak up on their behalf?

My friends, we ARE there! It is not just the life of one, but of millions, that are at stake. Our preborn children are destroyed by abortion at a high rate each day in our country. Where is the outcry? Who will speak for these little ones who cannot speak or write or vote or protest or even pray?

Don't let anyone tell you these children are not human. They are human from the moment of conception. That is not an opinion, that's a fact. It can be verified in any embryology textbook. Whether someone is human or not is not a matter of preference or belief, but of fact. As long as these babies continue to be destroyed and we continue to be silent, we are betraying our Christianity and our very humanity! Furthermore, we betray the mothers of these children, because abortion harms women, physically, emotionally, psychologically, socially, and spiritually! To be pro-life is to be pro-woman! To save the child is to save the mother as well!

So let us not be afraid to speak up for life! Do not be afraid to speak up against abortion! Never think that you cannot change a person's view on this issue. The truth is that you can, and when it comes to abortion, to change a person's view may mean that you save another person's life! Even if there is a person you feel you cannot change, speak up anyway! In this way, at least you are being faithful to your respect for life! And speak up continuously! The importance of a matter is often measured by how much you speak about it. We must keep this issue before our eyes and the eyes of the public, whether by private conversations or statements at meetings or letters or bumper stickers on our car. One way or another, let us speak up! Never let anyone say that you are talking about "the same old issue." Abortion today is not the same as abortion yesterday, because the hundred babies who died today never died before! Every abortion is a NEW tragedy and it demands a new response, a new voice of protest!

History will judge us on this issue. When future historians look back on the people of our day and on the incredible loss of some 30 million lives by abortion, what will their verdict be on us? What will they say about us? Will they call us cowards, who didn't speak up, or will they call us true Christians, who didn't keep silent?

Some people might say, "Father, we who come to church don't need to hear this as much as the people OUT THERE." All right, then, GO TELL THEM! Let us love the babies, let us love the mothers, and let us love Christ, who calls both them and us to LIFE.

The Baby Bottle Project (available beginning October 4th



A Note From Cardinal Blase Cupich

The Church teaches that receiving Holy Communion is not a private action but a communal one, as the very word "communion" implies. For that reason, the norm established by the Holy See for the universal Church and approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops is for the faithful to process together as an expression of their coming forward as the Body of Christ and to receive Holy

Communion standing. Processions are an ancient practice of the Church and have been part of the liturgy from the earliest days, assisting the faithful to always keep in mind that we are a pilgrim people, making our way together to the fulness of the heavenly banquet Christ has prepared for us. We process into the church. We process up to bring the gifts. We process to receive Holy Communion. We process out to carry the Lord into the world.

Nothing should be done to impede this sacred ritual of receiving communion or diminish its powerful symbol by disrupting an important moment by which the faithful, in processing together, express their faith that they are called to become the very Body of Christ they receive. Certainly, reverence can and should be expressed by bowing before the reception of Holy Communion, but no one should engage in a gesture that calls attention to oneself or disrupts the flow of the procession by assuming another posture. That would be contrary to the norms and tradition of the church, which all the faithful are urged to respect and observe.













Drodzy Parafianie,

Co to znaczy być chrześcijaninem w kategoriach codziennego zachowania? Jeśli ktoś podejdzie i uderzy cię w twarz, czy ta osoba zachowuje się jak chrześcijanin?

Z pewnością powiemy, że "nie". Skoro to jest takie jasne, że osoba

używająca przemocy w stosunku do innych nie można być dobrym chrześcijaninem, a inne osoby mówią, że można zabijać dziecko w łonie matki przez aborcję i nadal być dobrym chrześcijaninem, coś jest naprawdę nie tak z ich tokiem rozumowania. Jak zabijanie może być w porządku, a uderzenie w twarz czymś złym? Być chrześcijaninem, to znaczy stanąć po stronie życia, to znaczy bezustannie przeciwstawiać się niszczeniu niewinnego życia, to znaczy szanować ludzkie życie na wszystkich jego etapach i we wszystkich jego formach. Ten weekend poświęcony jest poszanowaniu życia, więc skoncentruję się na temacie aborcji.

W naszym społeczeństwie jest wiele ataków na ludzkie życie. Ludzie jednak w dużej mierze odwołują się do ochrony ich praw i otrzymują za to odszkodowanie. Jest jednak cała grupa ludzi, którzy codziennie są atakowani i nie mają jakiejkolwiek możliwości odwołania się do prawa. Tak naprawdę prawo nie uznaje ich jako ludzi. Oczywiście mamy na myśli nienarodzonych chłopców i dziewczynki w łonach ich matek. Nie mają nikogo, kto się za nimi wstawi, oprócz nas. Czy jesteśmy wystarczająco dobrymi chrześcijanami, aby dostrzec ich potrzeby i zabrać głos w ich imieniu?

Drodzy przyjaciele, my jesteśmy! To nie jest życie tylko jednego, ale zagrożone jest życie milionów. W naszym kraju, każdego dnia w szybkim tempie rośnie liczba aborcji, przez którą nasze nienarodzone dzieci są pozbawiane życia. Gdzie jest oburzenie? Kto przemówi w imieniu tych najmłodszych, którzy nie mogą mówić, pisać, głosować lub zaprotestować albo nawet się modlić?

Nie pozwólcie nikomu powiedzieć, że te dzieci nie są ludźmi. Są nimi od chwili poczęcia. To nie jest opinia, to jest fakt i może to być zweryfikowane w jakimkolwiek podręczniku Embriologii. Czy ktoś jest człowiekiem czy nie, to nie jest kwestia uprzywilejowania czy przekonań, ale faktu. Póki te niewinne dzieci będą zabijane, a my w dalszym ciągu będziemy milczeli, to zdradzamy nasze chrześcijaństwo i ludzkość! Co gorsza, oszukujemy matki tych dzieci, ponieważ aborcja wyrządza kobietom krzywdę fizyczną, emocjonalną, psychiczną, społeczną i duchową! Stanąć w obronie życia, to stanąć w obronie kobiet! Ocalić dziecko, to także ocalić matkę!

Nie bójmy się więc mówić w obronie życia! Nie bójmy się wypowiadać przeciwko aborcji! Nigdy nie myśl, że nie jesteś w stanie zmienić czyjegoś zdania na ten temat. Prawdą jest, że możesz, a jeśli chodzi o aborcję, to dzięki temu, że będziesz mówił, możesz uratować życie drugiego człowieka! Nawet jeśli czujesz, że nie będziesz mógł tej osoby zmienić, odezwij się! Przynajmniej w ten sposób jesteś wierny poszanowaniu życia! Nie przestawaj się odzywać! Nieraz ważność sprawy mierzona jest tym, jak często o niej mówimy. Musimy mieć ten problem przed naszymi oczami i oczami opinii publicznej, czy to w prywatnej konwersacji, wypowiedziach na spotkaniach, listach lub nawet naklejce na zderzaku naszego samochodu. Tak czy inaczej, odezwijmy się! Nigdy nikomu nie pozwól powiedzieć, że mówisz o "tym samym problemie". Aborcja dzisiaj nie jest taka sama jak wczoraj, ponieważ setka dzieci, która została zamordowana dzisiaj, nigdy wcześniej nie umarła! Każda aborcja jest NOWA tragedią i domaga się nowego odzewu i nowego głosu protestu!

W tej kwestii historia oceni nas sama. Kiedy historycy z przyszłości spojrzą wstecz na ludzi naszych czasów i na niewiarygodną zagładę jakiś 30 milionów niewinnych żyć przez aborcję, to jakichś będzie ich werdykt? Co o nas powiedzą?
