#### From the desk of Father Koys Dear Parishioners,

Have you ever changed your mind about something? I don't mean you decided to have chicken instead of steak for dinner or you went for a walk

instead of cleaning the kitchen. I mean changed your mind about something significant, almost life changing. Kind of like when a South sider realizes the best baseball team is on the Northside. I share this question with you today because Our Lord is telling us to how to be happy and it causes me to share one of those attitude changes that does help me embrace a more joyful spirit. "Happy those who weep now, you shall laugh".

My story begins with something that used to annoy me. It's something that people would say to me every now and then, and I know it was said from a desire to help me or comfort me. So, I mean no disrespect. It's just that it annoyed me. What's that annoying saving? It goes something like this, "Oh, don't worry so much, don't be troubled, if God wants you to have it, you'll have it, if not, so be it." You may be thinking why would a priest of God find that annoying? Shouldn't he be all about God's will? Well, you'd be right, every good Catholic should be about knowing God's will. Don't we say in the Our Father, "God's will be done here on earth as it is in heaven"? Absolutely.

Then why is "don't worry so much" so annoying at times? Because responsible people know that it takes effort to get things done. Responsible people make plans and create strategies, business plans for success. Responsible people see irresponsible people as the people who don't make plans, don't show any effort. Then they end up mooching off the spoils of the hard workers. Life throws so many challenges at us every day. So, when someone

says, "If it's God's will, you'll have it." Inside I say, "God helps those who help themselves. I shouldn't expect or depend on miracles to fix my problems or get things done". I imagine most of us have been there.

But now I find myself loving this mysterious notion of God's will. It truly can be a key game changer in the attitude department. Now, when I say to myself, or another says to me, "If God wills it, it will be done" a sense of peace comes over me. The kind of peace that Jesus encourages in His Beatitudes. If I say, "I really want all my parishioners to fully embrace Catholicism and make my parish a beacon of light for the diocese" or if I say, "I really want so and so to reconcile with their sibling or their spouse" I know I have to do as much as I can to accomplish it. But when I tell myself, "If God wills it, so it will be" the burden feels lighter, much lighter. It's a declaration that God is an active ingredient in all that goes on. God wills us all to be happy but we don't always will what God wills.







#### Z biurka wikariusza pastora Drodzy Parafianie,

Czy kiedykolwiek zmieniłeś zdanie na jakiś temat? Nie mam na myśli przeciętnej sytuacji, w której zdecydowałeś się na kurczaka zamiast steku na obiad lub poszedłeś na spacer zamiast posprzątać kuchnię. Mam na myśli natomiast zmianę

zdania na temat czegoś istotnego i ważnego, niemal zmieniającego życie. Coś w rodzaju momentu, gdy mieszkaniec południowej części miasta uświadamia sobie, że najlepsza drużyna baseballowa jest jednak na północy. Dzielę się z Wami tym pytaniem, ponieważ nasz Pan mówi nam jak być szczęśliwym. A to z kolei skłania mnie to do podzielenia się jedną z tych zmian postawy, które pomagają mi przyjąć bardziej radosnego ducha "Błogosławieni, którzy teraz płaczecie, albowiem śmiać się będziecie."

Moja historia zaczyna się od czegoś, co kiedyś mnie irytowało. To coś, co ludzie mówili mi od czasu do czasu, a wiem, że wynikało to z ich dobrej chęci pomocy lub pocieszenia mnie. Nie chciałbym więc nikogo urazić. Po prostu mnie to irytowało. Co to było za irytujące powiedzenie? Brzmi mniej więcej tak: "Och, nie martw się tak bardzo, nie przejmuj się, jeśli Bóg chce żebyś to miał, to będziesz to miał, a jeśli nie, to trudno." Pewno się zastanawiasz, dlaczego ksiądz uważałby to za irytujące? Czyż nie powinien być całkowicie oddany woli Bożej? Oczywiście, każdy dobry katolik powinien dążyć do poznania woli Bożej. Przecież mówimy w modlitwie "Ojcze nasz": "Bądź wola Twoja, jako w niebie, tak i na ziemi".

Dlaczego więc to zdanie "nie martw się tak bardzo" bywa czasem irytujące, ponieważ odpowiedzialni ludzie wiedzą, że aby coś osiągnąć potrzeba wysiłku. Odpowiedzialni ludzie tworzą plany i strategie, biznesplany prowadzące do sukcesu. Odpowiedzialni ludzie postrzegają nieodpowiedzialnych jako tych, którzy nie planują i nie wykazują żadnego wysiłku, a potem korzystają z owoców pracy ludzi odpowiedzialnych. Życie każdego dnia stawia przed nami wiele wyzwań. Więc kiedy ktoś mówi: "Jeśli taka jest wola Boża, to się stanie", w duchu odpowiadam: "Bóg pomaga tym, którzy pomagają sobie sami. Nie powinienem oczekiwać ani polegać na cudach, aby rozwiązały moje problemy czy wykonały za mnie pracę." Myślę, że większość z nas była w takiej sytuacji.



#### What are the Works of Mercy I Should Perform During this Jubilee Year of Hope?

Pope Francis declared in his decree on the granting of indulgence during the Jubilee Year of Hope that, besides the Pilgrimages through the Holy Doors, we should be signs of hope for others by doing acts of mercy. This way, we *become* a pilgrimage of hope, and we grow in holiness ourselves while bringing Christ's love to others.

"In addition, the faithful will be able to obtain the Jubilee Indulgence if, with a devout spirit, they participate in popular missions, spiritual exercises, or formation activities on the documents of the Second Vatican Council and the Catechism of the Catholic Church, held in a church or other suitable place, according to the mind of the Holy Father."




"The Jubilee Plenary Indulgence can also be obtained through initiatives that put into practice, in a concrete and generous way, the spirit of penance which is, in a sense, the soul of the Jubilee. In particular the penitential nature of Friday can be rediscovered through abstaining, in a spirit of penance, at least for one day of the week from futile distractions (real but also virtual distractions, for example, the use of the media and/or social networks), from superfluous consumption (for example by fasting or practicing abstinence according to the general norms of the Church and the indications of the Bishops), as well as by donating a proportionate sum of money to the poor; by supporting works of a religious or social nature, especially in support of the defense and protection of life in all its phases, but also by supporting the quality of life of abandoned children, young people in difficulty, the needy or lonely elderly people, or migrants from various countries "who leave their homelands behind in search of a better life for themselves and for their families" (Spes non confundit, 13); it can also be obtained by dedicating a reasonable portion of one's free time to voluntary activities that are of service to the community or to other similar forms of personal commitment."

Consider which actions of mercy or penance you as a teen or adult may be able to do:

- Get a group together to study parts of the Catholic Catechism?
- Spend time with those in need? The lonely, the elderly, the disabled?
- Do acts of penance such as abstinence from the internet, your smart phone or social media?
- Skip one meal every Friday, if your health allows?
- Give up shopping? Or give half of your clothes possessions to the poor?
- Give alms to the church or a mission that helps the poor?
- Volunteer for a pro-life organization helping mothers choose life?
- Become a mentor for a struggling youth?
- Do acts of community service such as picking up trash or collecting for the food pantry?
- Help someone who has immigrated from another country?

The other normal requirements for an indulgence would still apply: detachment from even venial sin, Confession, Communion, prayers for the Pope's intentions, etc. knowing this is all through Christ's merits on the cross, uniting your sacrifices to His.


